DID YOU KNOW...

- 14 new neonatal intensive care beds will open at Alberta Children's Hospital (ACH) by October 2013, specializing in complex neonatal patients who require consults from multiple services at ACH.
- The South Health Campus will be fully operational in late 2013 and will have 2,400 full-time equivalent staff, approximately 180 physicians, 269 inpatient beds, 11 operating

rooms and will service 200,000 outpatient visits and perform 2,500 births every year.

- AHS is significantly expanding continuing care and will add 350 beds in the Calgary Zone by the end of 2013.
- The Foothills Medical Centre in Calgary is the largest tertiary hospital in Canada, with more than 1,000 inpatient beds.

PRIMARY CARE NETWORKS

Many family physicians in Alberta are part of a Primary Care Network (PCN). A PCN generally includes a group of family doctors working together with a team of other health professionals such as nurses, nurse practitioners, dietitians and pharmacists to provide care to a defined group of patients.

Services offered by some PCNs might include complex chronic disease support and clinics for patients who are not attached to a family doctor. Some PCNs also provide after-hours options. Today, Alberta has 40 Primary Care Networks and more in development.

LEGEND OF SERVICES

- Emergency Departments. 24-hour care – If you are concerned that you are seriously ill or injured, go to the nearest emergency department. Patients with potentially lifethreatening conditions should immediately phone 911.
- Urgent Care Centres. Urgent care centres provide extended hours access for unexpected but non-lifethreatening health concerns that require same day or evening treatment. Patients coming to urgent care centres may arrive on their own, or be transported there by ambulance. Urgent Care may only offer limited hours. Please check with your local facility to confirm hours of operation.
- Emergency Limited Hours. These communities have emergency health care services available within limited hours. Please contact the facility in your community to confirm the hours for emergency care. Please refer to the back of this map for contact numbers in your community.
- **Hospitals.** These are AHS and AHS partner facilities for treating urgent, complex or other health needs on an inpatient basis. Some sites may provide hospital care, continuing care or community health care from one site, called a Health Centre. (Partner facilities are denoted in **brown**.)
- **Community and Public Health Services.** These facilities provide a wide range of health services which may include prenatal, postpartum, health promotion/disease and injury prevention, bereavement services, communicable disease and school health, and many other community care, public health and wellness programs.
- Primary Care Networks. Many family physicians in Alberta are part of a Primary Care Network (PCN)
 a group of family doctors working together with a team of other health professionals such as nurses, dietitians and pharmacists to provide care to a defined group of patients.
- **Addiction and Mental Health Services.** These facilities and programs are for the treatment and care of people with mental health or addiction challenges.
- Cancer Care Centres. AHS offers a variety of programs, services and facilities that work with those affected by cancer, as well as provide programs to help Albertans reduce their risk of developing cancer. - Continuing Care. These are AHS or AHS partner sites offering long term and/or supportive living options in this community.

- Family Doctors. Your best option for medical care and continuity. They can diagnose and treat most medical issues, provide periodic health exams, supervise chronic illness and mental health issues, provide referrals to other medical consultants and specialists, if needed.
- Walk-In Clinics. If you don't have a family doctor, some communities have walk-in clinics that often don't require an appointment. Walk-in clinics are staffed by family physicians. Many have extended hours into evenings and weekends, providing another option for after-hours care.
- Pharmacists. Offer a wide range of services that can help you and your family maintain good health and avoid emergency situations.
- Specialized Programs and Services. There are many other health care programs and services available for various health care needs, such as public and community health centres, cancer clinics, physiotherapy, and more. You can call Health Link at 1-866-408-LINK (5465) or your local community health centre to find out what's available in your area.
- X-ray and Diagnostic Imaging Clinics. You may be sent to have procedures such as X-rays, MRIs and other types of scans done.
- Labs. Labs are facilities where you may be sent to have blood, urine or other samples taken.
