DID YOU KNOW...

- The South Zone has major capital projects under way valued at nearly \$350 million. These include large redevelopment projects at Chinook Regional Hospital in Lethbridge and Medicine Hat Regional Hospital. A \$30-million parkade with a rooftop helipad and 810 stalls opened in 2011 at Chinook Regional. A \$6.4 million upgrade to the Bow Island Health Centre was completed early in 2013.
- A 10-bed hospice, operated in partnership with Covenant Health and Alberta Health Services, opened in 2012 and provides a new option for Medicine Hat and area residents. The Carmel Hospice also provides 10 community support beds, available to individuals who need respite care or a period of convalescence following hospitalization.
- Telehealth technology is enhancing patient care and is especially valuable in rural settings. For example,

emergency physicians in Lethbridge, Brooks, and Medicine Hat can connect with specialists in Calgary to assess patients presenting with stroke symptoms and determine a plan of care.

- Two medical oncologists (cancer specialists) were hired in 2012 for the Jack Ady Cancer Centre in Lethbridge.
- Primary Care Networks (PCNs) operating in the east and west parts of the zone treat thousands of patients and provide enhanced proactive care for patients with chronic disease. In the east, the Palliser PCN has 32 clinics, 69 physicians treating 89,361 patients, and in the west, Chinook PCN has 26 clinics, with 126 physicians treating 146,940 patients.
- The South Zone is home to 15 acute-care hospitals and health centres.

This PCN includes the communities of Bassano, Bow Island, Brooks, Medicine Hat and Oyen.

LEGEND OF SERVICES


- Emergency Departments. 24-hour care If you are concerned that you are seriously ill or injured, go to the nearest emergency department. Patients with potentially life-threatening conditions should immediately phone 911.
- Emergency Limited Hours. These communities have emergency health care services available within limited hours. Please contact the facility in your community to confirm the hours for emergency care. Please refer to the back of this map for contact numbers in your community.
- **Hospitals.** These are AHS and AHS partner facilities for treating urgent, complex or other health needs on an inpatient basis. Some sites may provide hospital care, continuing care or community health care from one site, called a Health Centre.
- Community and Public Health Services. These facilities provide a wide range of health services which may include prenatal, postpartum, health promotion/disease and injury prevention, bereavement services, communicable disease and school health, and many other community care, public health and wellness programs.
- Primary Care Networks. Many family physicians in Alberta are part of a Primary Care Network (PCN) a group of family doctors working together with a team of other health professionals such as nurses, dietitians and pharmacists to provide care to a defined group of patients.
- Addiction and Mental Health Services. These facilities and programs are for the treatment and care of people with mental health or addiction challenges.
- © Cancer Care Centres. AHS offers a variety of programs, services and facilities that work with those affected by cancer, as well as provide programs to help Albertans reduce their risk of developing cancer. - **Continuing Care.** These are AHS or AHS partner sites offering long term and/or supportive living options in this community.

OTHER HEALTH CARE OPTIONS

- **Health Link Alberta.** A free, round-the-clock, telephone advice and health information service. Toll free: 1-866-408-LINK (5465).
- Family Doctors. Your best option for medical care and continuity. They can diagnose and treat most medical issues, provide periodic health exams, supervise chronic illness and mental health issues, provide referrals to other medical consultants and specialists, if needed.
- Walk-In Clinics. If you don't have a family doctor, some communities have walk-in clinics that often don't require an appointment. Walk-in clinics are staffed by family physicians. Many have extended hours into evenings and weekends, providing another option for after-hours care.
- Pharmacists. Offer a wide range of services that can help you and your family maintain good health and avoid emergency situations.
- Specialized Programs and Services. There are many other health care programs and services available for various health care needs, such as public and community health centres, cancer clinics, physiotherapy, and more. You can call Health Link at 1-866-408-LINK (5465) or your local community health centre to find out what's available in your area.
- X-ray and Diagnostic Imaging Clinics. You may be sent to have procedures such as X-rays, MRIs and other types of scans dohe.
- Labs. Labs are facilities where you may be sent to have blood, urine or other samples taken.
